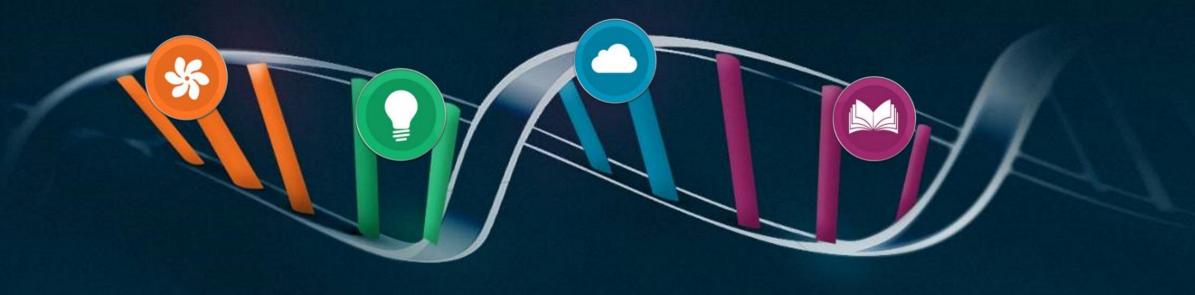

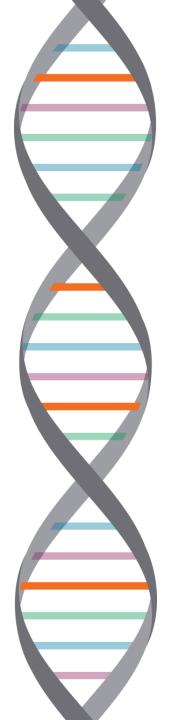

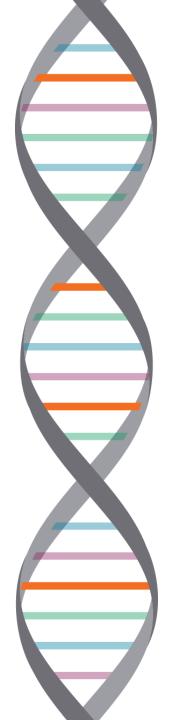

- Privacy concerns



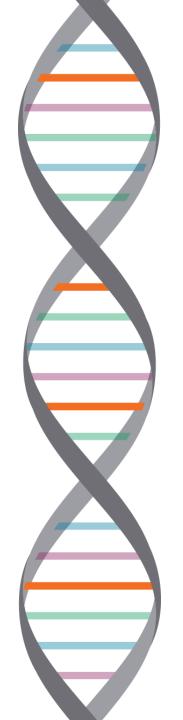

Generally, fast food is not great for our health. Obesity and the associated health problems are a huge challenge for Peterborough, especially childhood obesity.

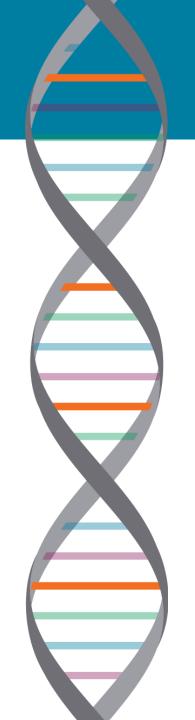

#### Public Health Focus Segment for Accelerated Collaboration

- Ochildren and Young people's health: -
- Bring existing data together with new sources (e.g. NCMP, deprivation, attainment, neighbourhood data, educational attainment, location of fast food restaurants etc...)
- Align the data and make it accessible through visualisation
- Deliver a focussed programme of Accelerated Collaboration amongst partners and stakeholders
- Agree a plan that has wide buy-in as part of the JSNA refresh, that is evidence based and easy to communicate

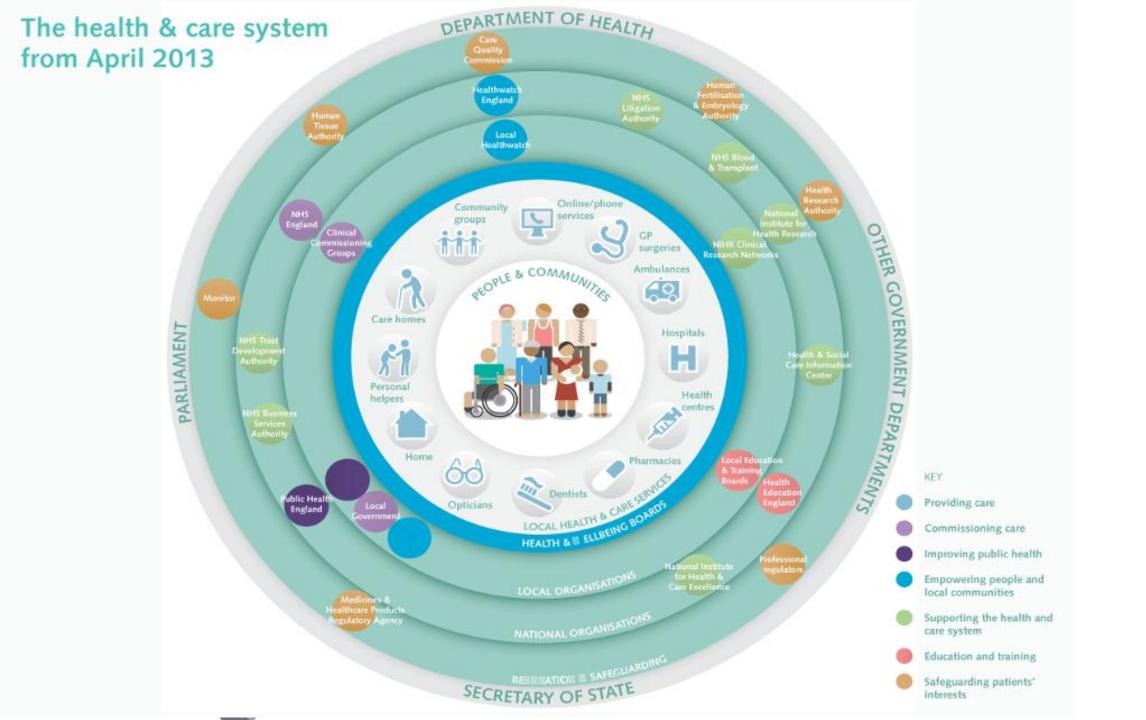

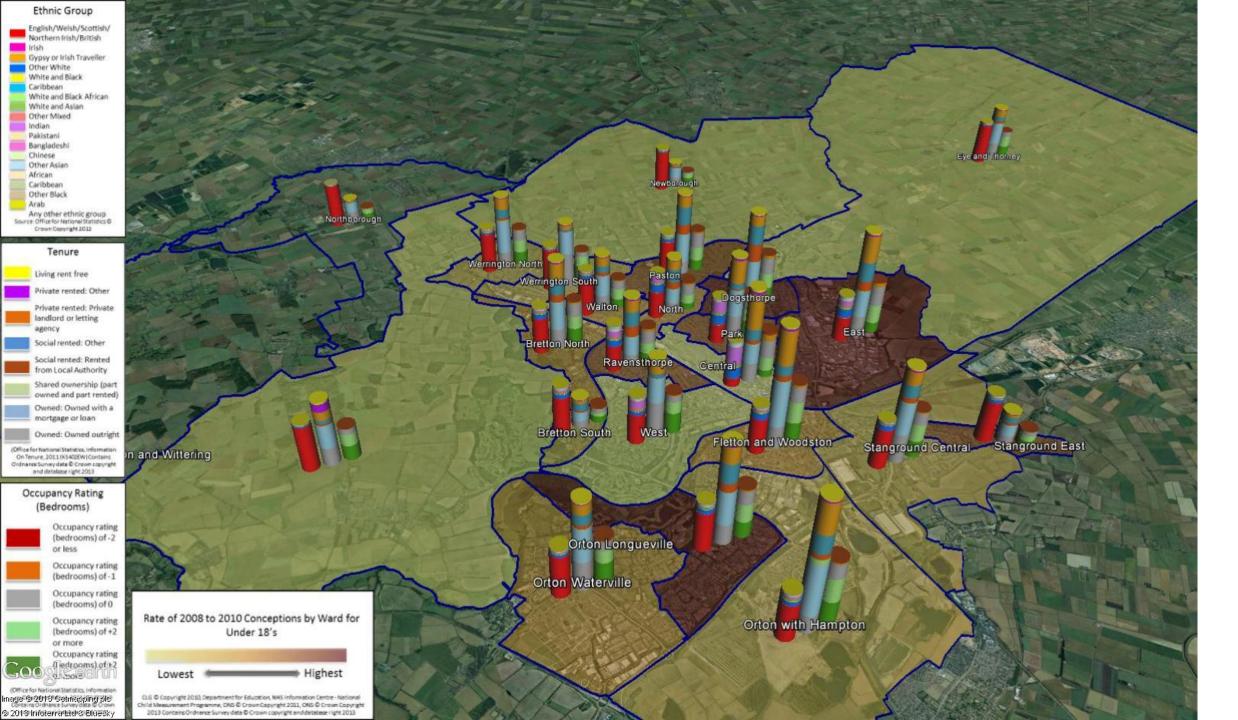

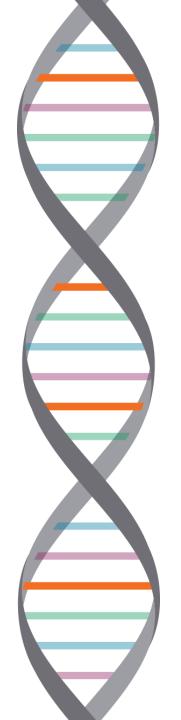






### **Public Health Deliverables**
