What is Wikiprogress?

- * Wikiprogress is a crowd-sourced knowledge portal of data and other resources related to well-being and sustainability.
- * Thanks to our involvement in Web-COSI, we have upgraded the site, launching Wikiprogress 2.0 in October this year
- * Improved capacity for:
 - * Data-sharing
 - * User engagement

History of Wikiprogress

- * Launched in 2009, with the aim of collecting together the knowledge of the 'beyond GDP' community in one place, using the same model and software as Wikipedia
- * Hosted and supported by OECD, but completely open (OECD holds no responsibility for content and does not favour own content)
- * 2000 articles and large, diverse network: receives up to 20,000 visitors per month, 35k newsletter subscribers.

Need for change

- * Wikipedia software (Mediawiki) is good for crowdsourcing articles, but:
 - * Does not provide a good structure for sharing data, reports, websites, or other resources (Wikiprogress.stat not fit for purpose)
 - Not easy to contribute for those without basic html
 - * Not a good content management system for browsing

Web-COSI and Wikiprogress

- * Shared objective: use digital platform to open up wellbeing statistics to new audiences.
- * Focus on:
 - * Crowdsourcing info and expertise from WP network
 - * Public outreach, especially young people
 - * Improve data-sharing capacity of the site

Crowdsourcing knowledge and best practice

- * Workshops, online discussions, social media outreach on the role of technology in engaging citizens in 'Beyond GDP' discussion'.
- * Key themes:
 - * Citizen engagement supports policy use of statistics
 - * Citizens can be data producers (crowdsourced data), processors (e.g. data viz, apps) or end users
 - * Limitations of new data sources (quality, coverage, etc.)
 - * Capacity-building and digital exclusion
 - * Greater accessibility of 'open' data
- * Crowdsourced map of initiatives

Public outreach and youth engagement

- * Stepped up social media over 1.5 million people reached
- * Youth portal and engagement activities
 - * Wikiprogress University
 - * Online Consultation on Youth Well-being (Spring 2015)
 - * Data Viz contest (Summer 2015)

Wikiprogress '2.0': data portal and upgrade

- * 'Wiki of progress statistics': both official and non-official data
- * CKAN open data software: free, open-source, userfriendly, well-structured yet flexible
- * New portal launched in beta in August 2014, then extended with Wordpress. All content migrated and new site launched in October 2015.




